The Truth about Addiction

The truth is... I was a drug addict. Drugs were my quick fix, easy solution to every ailment. One for boredom, one for excitement, one for depression, one for anxiety, one to lose weight, one for more energy to finish the chores, one to escape my body, one to escape my mind, one to feel loved, and last but not least, one to take away the pain. Eventually my constant companion, addiction, began to fail me despite constant drug use.

What was wrong, that I needed to take all these drugs? How did I lose control of myself? I could see me killing myself with the drugs and I didn't want to die. With nowhere else to turn, I ran to my Bible, held it tightly and said, "God give me a word from your word." I proceeded to randomly open it, and there it was staring me in the face, "oh ye of little faith," he said, just like he had pointed out the three other times I had randomly flipped it open, in the previous days. However, I blindly dismissed this as a coincidence.

The truth is... I no longer had the ability to control myself. I gave away the ability to keep myself sober, after many occasions, choosing to sin. I had

vexed the Holy Spirit and pushed him out of my life completely. I spent five days in detox with many "panic attacks" which included hyperventilating, childlike temper tantrums, nausea, vomiting and uncontrollable shaking. There was extreme physical pain in my organs, body aches and serious nerve problems which made me unable to hold on to anything; not a fork or a cigarette, for a day and a half, because of unexplained body spasms. I said mean and hurtful things to the people who were trying to help me, as I was under the delusion that they were part of the problem.

After the drugs had left my body, the obsession remained. I was told that addiction is a three part disease that affects the body (the physical addiction), the mind (the obsession for more), and the spirit (that empty feeling inside). I was told that this is a lifelong disease with no cure. They told me I would never be able to drink like a "normal person." It was said, I would need to go to meetings for the rest of my life to stay sober, to keep me from dying from my progressive and terminal disease.

The spiritual care counselor at the facility told me I was there because I was spiritually bankrupt. After a short child-like debate, she challenged me to use creative thinking to come up with one reason I might be spiritually bankrupt. After a week of rattling my

scattered brain, I had an epiphany. I came to the realization that I was putting my faith in drugs and not Jesus. "Oh ye of little faith." As it turns out, God was speaking to me after all.

I returned home from rehab and went to meetings religiously, vet still had a void inside that I was trying to fill, only this time with things other than drugs and alcohol. I tried meditation and lots of exercise, reading all kinds of self-help books and watching documentaries. I tried eating lots of sweets and even shopping online. None could fill it. One day (out of money and out of options) a friend of mine invited me to The Harvest, I was welcomed with open arms. It meant so much to me to be accepted by people who love lesus and who understood what I was going through.

Unlike other meetings I had attended, at the Harvest I didn't have to identify myself as an addict. At the Harvest, I felt so loved

and nurtured. I got my belly fed, my mind fed, and my spirit fed. Then, during the praise and worship, a miracle happened. The Holy Spirit filled that empty space and I was overwhelmed by His love and compassion. The following week I could no longer identify myself as an addict. I no longer have a desire to use at all.

If addiction is a disease then I am healed by the stripes of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and the Comforter, his Holy Spirit lives in me today. Evidently it takes a three in one Higher power, who is Jesus, to delete a three in one disease, that is sin.

I no longer feel I belong in other meetings, where I see empty spaces that need to be filled with the Holy Spirit. I see people who, just like me, have been affected by their decision to put their trust in someone or something, instead of turning to lesus first. The blood of lesus is the only cure-all. I am confident in the fact that the Harvest is a safe, family oriented place. A place where I can invite others, who struggle with similar temptations as me, to get filled with the love of Jesus, and Jearn that real forgiveness comes from Jesus Christ, I thank God for the Harvest.

The Harvest focuses on discovering the new person through Christ Jesus.

Everyone has a story, and mine was pretty standard... until I left home with little over a week's notice, for a fifteen-month trip overseas. Two and a half months in Singapore, training with Victory Family Center, and twelve months in the East African country of Tanzania.

Our mission was to plant 25 churches among the Rungwa people, who are considered a Least Reached People Group (meaning there are few to no indigenous churches). We learned the model of discipleship: concentrated teaching and relationship with individuals who, in turn, would go out and teach others. This is based on Jesus' command in Matthew 20:18-20, and Paul's imploring to "follow him as he followed Christ."

Once I reached our small village of Kasansas, it was as though I was blinded to everyone but the children. I've always loved kids, and how could I not love these? Wild and animated, with beautiful, dark almond eyes, coming in droves from every home I passed, and appearing at

dawn outside of our compound. It didn't take long for me to feel the tugging to invest in the little ones full time, and I was given full control of building a children's ministry from the ground up.

It was a full-time job. Our house was surrounded with children from sun up to sun down. Everywhere I went. streams of children followed me -more out of curiosity than anything else. I started doing mommy things at first: sewing clothes, giving haircuts with our generator and electric clippers. bathing little ones and, whenever possible, giving away what food we had around the house. I bought books for the children to look at and eventually a soccer ball. After a few months I began Bible story groups, at the two ends of the village, twice a week. The children loved the stories and were very excited to tell me something they learned about each week. Saturdays became game day, with Duck, Duck. Goose being the all-time favorite, for all ages. I was also given the opportunity to teach English at the Primary school a few days a week, which was a challenge since I have no formal training to teach. After a few more months. I was blessed with Tumaini, a young man whom I able to disciple. He's continuing with the children's ministry in my absence, and from

what I hear, is doing even better than I did.

To say that I loved being with the kids each day, would be an understatement for the joy that I found in being a part of their lives. Tiny black hands pulling my "funny" long hair, little voices calling for "Stefania" at all hours of the day, and games of tag all over the front vard. My eves fill with tears, even as I write this. because of how much my heart hurts without them. I was able to be a part of their lives and watch how they responded to what they learned about Jesus; how they grew softer and more open to him, as young as they were. They gave me a chance to learn to love under pressure and were my best teachers.

The two most amazing things I've found about mission work is: First, that no matter how certain you are that you are there to be an influence and "save" others, God uses that time to save you. At my worst moments there's the temptation to feel a bit proud of myself for my "sacrifice," but I did not get to Africa through my hard work. I was put there by a God who wanted to break down my pride and reach the parts of my heart that had been so easy to hide, with all the comfort and routine of my life in America. Second, I've learned the reality that the life of a servant isn't charitable and humanistic in its focus, as much as it is a life spent valuing God first, and then His people. I cannot allow the basis of my life to be motivated solely out of love for people, because when people manipulate or use me, I get my feelings hurt. I feel I've lost my reason to continue in ministry because I'm not being appreciated the way I want. But, when my actions are motivated out of a desire to see God's name made great in all the earth, even when people frustrate me, I will not quit.

I'm no hero and certainly no saint. My story is like anyone else's. A story of being sought by Christ for a deeper and more authentic relationship with Him. Our lives, as believers, are about valuing Him as supreme. teaching others that truth, and living it out together. Helping each other when we fall. We all have the obligation, the honor and the ability to see His Kingdom come on earth, as it is in heaven. Whether we're young or old, educated or uneducated, and regardless of whether we call America or Africa our home.

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, [a] baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matt. 28:19-20



After having some issues with my stomach, my doctor sent me to have a Contrast Cat Scan at a local hospital, this past December, 2013. Upon returning home, I received a phone call from my doctors telling me to go immedately to the emergency room, as the scan showed I was bleeding from the aneurism repair performed 8 years prior. I'd had an aneurysm in my aorta, that went from the end of the arch from the heart, down to where the aorta splits into arteries in your legs.

At the emergency room, the staff and doctors began more tests, and concluded that they needed to operate immediately. Karol asked them if it would be a major surgery, like the first one, and they said, "yes." Karol then told them that she wanted the Cleveland Clinic - who had done my first repair - to do the operation. They notified them and the Clinic said they would be ready for me. They wanted to air flight me to Cleveland immediately and, after deciding they couldn't wait for the weather to clear, chose to drive me by ambulance. Karol was not allowed to go with me in the ambulance, so she caught the first plane to Cleveland.

During our wait for the ambulance to come get me, Karol and I prayed together for a long period. We were actually saying our goodbyes, because we knew how serious this could be. When she got home she started notifying friends, bible studies we belonged to, our church, along with other churches we knew, to start praying for me. The three doctors had told us that I was bleeding internally and could be fatal at any minute. Hundreds of prayers were being offered to God on my behalf.

I arrived at the Cleveland Clinic at 2:00am and they took more scans. The surgeon, who had performed the original aneurism repair, came into my room and said, "Our scans show that there is NO BLEEDING and your aneurysm repair is as good as the day I did, it 8 years ago." He also said that, had they operated on me in Dayton, they probably would have killed me.

When I got back to Dayton a couple of days later, the doctor there showed Karol and me the Cat Scan report, which stated I had multiple points that showed bleeding. I asked them why there was such a difference and could it have been read wrong. They said no, these three doctors were very experienced and read these scans all the time, knowing what to look for. They had no answer and couldn't explain the difference. But WE KNEW WHY!

Never doubt the power of PRAYER and the POWER of the Lord to heal. God answered prayer and healed me. Do I believe in miracles? YES! He is still touching our lives today for His Glory and Praise!



Naples only has two Christian bookstores, and neither is on this side of town. What a great service to provide our church members - a store conveniently located in our own church! Another benefit is that we can assure that everything we carry in our store lines up with our church's theology and vision. At Books of Hope, everything we carry represents who we are, spiritually and theologically.

All of these thoughts were coursing through me as I realized that, if my department opened up and ran a church bookstore, we could generate enough funds that we may (dare I hope?) never have to do a Music Department fundraiser again!

I put together a business proposal and presented it to the church Board. The original proposal was to put the bookstore in the Ministry Center lobby, and to include a café as well. However, the cost of renovating the lobby was much more than we wanted to spend, so the scope was scaled back to fit into a classroom in the sanctuary building. The Word of God tells us not to despise our day of small beginnings (Zechariah 4:10).

Last summer, when Blockbuster Video on Pine Ridge Road went out of business, we procured shelving at a fraction of the cost of new shelving. We then set up our contract with DaySpring Greeting Cards, and purchased our card display, and more than 80 greeting card designs.

We bought books, lots of books – by reputable ministers of the Word of

God. Names like Copeland, Hagin, Capps, Meyer, Moore, Hayford, and Hagee. We have 19 categories of books and hundreds of titles, many at 30%-60% off of retail. We have fiction and non-fiction; even have a section of New Hope staff favorites. Best of all, if we don't have it, we can probably order it and have it in by the following week.

The bookstore is a work in progress. We look forward to the potential it has to offer great products to our members. We would still like to someday see it move to the Ministry Center, be open throughout the week, and merge with a café. Gives us a goal to shoot for! Mostly, I'm thrilled that my department doesn't have to rely on fundraisers to bring in extra revenue. **Did 1 mention** that I hate fundraisers?
