Good News Club

For the past several years New Hope Ministries has sponsored a Good News Club at Calusa Park Elementary School. This year's club had over 80 children registered and over 50 attending each week. With eleven adult volunteers we split the group in half, making a kindergarten and first grade group and a 2nd to 5th grade group.

We use curriculum from Child Evangelism Fellowship, and the classes consist of praise and worship, prayer, a lesson, and a review game. The younger group has had occasional puppet shows, and the older group had what we call "The God Can." The children had the opportunity to write down their prayer requests and put them in "The God Can." Each request is prayed over at the end of class. Of great concern for many of the children was a teacher who was in a car accident with injuries on Easter Sunday. One girl has asked for prayer for her parents to get their "green card" so they can go back to their home country and visit her older sister.

Some of the children attend church regularly. However, a large number have no church home, and we encourage both the children and their parents to come visit NHM. Many are already looking forward to Kidzfest this June.

We are grateful to the Collier

County School Board and Calusa Park Elementary School for allowing us to come every Tuesday and offer this club. We are also thankful to the parents for allowing us to spend time with their children and teach them the Word of God.

We love the enthusiasm of the children, especially those who make it a point to show off the Bibles they have proudly brought to the club. One girl in the older group brought in a huge book of Bible stories and insisted on reading one of the stories to the class. She pointed out that this book had been in her family for many years and was valued, not only for its content, but for its great age as well. Upon examination, it was noted the book was published in 1971! I guess to a 9 year old, 43 years is very old!



Good News Club is over now for this school year, but we are eagerly looking forward to next year's club. We are in need of additional adult volunteers as we've been asked to start a second club in Golden Gate City. Anyone interested in volunteering may contact Pastor Steve McGraw at the church office.

Testimony of Kenia Pollara

The doctor looked at my mammogram and said three times, "I see brightness all around your breasts."

Jesus is light and life and it was His touch, His healing power, that had melted away four or five painful lumps in my breasts.

Teachers from the Sunday morning Healing Class were invited to teach a healing class at the NHSM. It was one of the final Monday night classes for the 2014-15 school year and I would be graduating within a few weeks. During the class I was reminded of the authority I have as a child of God, over sickness and disease.

I was scheduled to have a mammogram on Wednesday and I was really dreading it. My first test, a Breast Specific Gamma Imaging (BSGI) had been performed in 2012. Hard lumps had developed after I stopped breast feeding my son and my doctor was concerned. The test was extremely painful, as was the follow-up in 2013. Even the ultrasound was painful, so I skipped the test in 2014. Now it's 2015 and my doctor is insistent.

On Tuesday evening, the dread I felt was so intense that I was prepared to tell them I was in too much pain, so they would postpone the appointment. That's when I was prompted by the Holy Spirit to anoint myself with oil

and pray. I began, "God, please don't let there be any pain when I have this test." For the next thirty minutes I continued praying and seeking His wisdom. I then began to repeat, "God, melt these lumps, in the name of Jesus," and as I did so I felt them get smaller and smaller. They just melted away as I prayed!

Thank you, Jesus! Your death on the cross paid for my sins and your healing work has already been accomplished! All we are required to do is believe and recieve our salvation and healing.

They [the lumps] just melted away as I prayed!

Everyday I see patients who could possibly die tomorrow. I take every opportunity to encourage them; to talk to them about Jesus and pray with them, if they wish, before the doctor sees them. Now, I have another wonderful testimony of God's healing power to share with them.

The doctor I work with is not (yet) a believer, but I have shared my testimony and believe that it's just a matter of time...

For some time I'd had the desire to vote and I love this privilege above all. I do believe MY vote CAN make a difference. I don't like hearing people ask, "What difference does my vote make?"

Besides the right to vote, we Americans have many other wonderful freedoms given to us, if we choose to recognize and use them. We have the freedom to worship where and whom we desire. This should be something that all people in America take advantage of! Unfortunately many only turn to the local church and God when they are in need. I was working in the New Hope Ministries office the week of 9/11 and remember how many people

flocked to the church wanting answers to the tragic happenings of that day. Many who came were first time visitors. It's awesome that we live in a country that allows our church doors to be open at all times.

We also have the freedom to travel freely within our own state, and from state to state, and take in the beauty of God's creation. We are free to be thankful - out loud-for His magnificent handiwork all around us. It's comforting to know that the words "Thank you, Father" can be spoken freely and openly, without any fear or worry that our words could put us in jail.

Being an American means that each year on Memorial Day we are free to remember the men and women who have given their lives for that freedom. Every Veterans Day we are free to celebrate all those who have served in the military, and on Independence Day (July 4th) we may gather freely, without fear, with family and friends to commemorate the 1776 adoption of the Declaration of Independence. "...One Nation, under God, indivisible, with lib-

erty and justice for all."

Jail Ministry

New Hope Ministries has many different types of outreach programs. One is the Collier County Jail Ministry. There are five of us that visit the women in jail every Saturday at 1:00pm. Let me give a shout out to Sherry, Cindy, Brenda and Barbara! Each of us has a different style of teaching, so we alternate each week. This gives the women a variety, yet the foundation of Jesus Christ is unwavering.

A question that I often hear is: "Aren't you scared to go into the jail?" My answer to that is, "Nope! Not even a little bit!" (The other members of this ministry will agree with me on that.) I tell them, "It's scarier going out into the world some days than it is going into the jail."

The women we meet are hungry for change. They have come to the point that there is nowhere else to look but up. They want to come hear the Word of God. They sign up to attend on their own. They are open to receive. They are precious women, and sometimes I wonder how they ended up in there. We never ask their offense because we would never want our human judgement to get in the way of showing the love of Jesus Christ. These women are people just like everyone else. They are beautifully broken while they are in there, and it's an honor to be able to encourage them and teach them about who they are in Christ and how much they are loved by the King of Kings.

Attendance averages 15 ladies each week. Sometimes more, sometimes less, and we are seeing 4 or 5 salvations each week! It's absolutely amazing! But the ministry does not stop there. Eventually the girls will get out, and we always invite them to New Hope and tell them to come find us. This is where you, as the church body, can help out. We all need to be available to help people get back on their feet. We are not enablers, but we are encouragers. If someone is truly seeking the things of God, then we need to be available to them. Whether just in prayer or making relationships, and opening ourselves up to them

If you are interested in ministering in the jail, please inquire about the process to get involved. It is a true blessing to be a part of this ministry

NHM Event/ Ministry Center

he Event/Ministry Center is available for many different types of activities. Over the past 12 months several wedding receptions have been held in the facility. Additionally, there have been local trade shows, a doll show, quilt show, baby showers, a karate exhibition, concerts, various seminars, Lifeline Screenings, and even a wedding ceremony.

Currently the gymnasium is being rented weekly for volleyball; during the summer months there is "open gym." The Harvest Recovery Group meets upstairs every Friday evening. The food pantry is open on Tuesday & Thursday mornings. All The King's Men meet weekly in the dining room. The New Hope School of Ministries meets in the lecture hall twice weekly from August to May. Classrooms are utilized for a number of classes on Sunday morning, and groups on Friday evenings.

The facilities are used for a variety of events: special speakers, Family Fun Days (Easter & Labor Day), Annual Valentine's Dinner, Mother's Day Brunch, Annual Motorcycle Rally, Annual Hunting Banquet, Annual Fishing Banquet, Annual Fall Fest, Seder Dinner, Boys' Campout, Volunteer Appreciation Dinner, Family and Classic Movie Nights, New Members' Dinner, many Heart2Heart women's events, and a voting precinct.

The full service commercial kitchen is utilized for the events listed above and for our weekly dinners on Wednesday nights. Recently Chef Brian and his volunteers were busy in the kitchen preparing food for the church out-

reach to the Collier County Fair workers, Barron Collier teachers, and last summer, the teachers at Calusa Park Elementary.

ne year ago, I was diagnosed with breast cancer. I knew something was wrong, of course, but had no idea it was stage 4! When the reality of the situation had settled into the rational part of my brain. I decided that I should just let go and let whatever would happen, happen. I had seen so many people try to fight this particular demon over my 30+ years in healthcare and only one person I knew of had survived. She had been healed at the little holiness church I had attended as a young adult.

Tony, my husband, was devastated by my diagnosis and maybe a little from my reaction - giving up. So, I told my oncologist to hit it with the biggest poison she had in her arsenal. She did. For five months Lunderwent chemotherapy and it did seem to be working, but what was the root cause? I've always felt disease was evil in its very nature. I remembered the sweet little lady from my youth that had been healed by the laying on of hands; my hands were involved then too. I had "backslid" so far away from my loving God that I didn't know if I could be heard - until I recognized who was speaking to me. I told my husband that I wanted to find a church, a real church, not one that sugarcoats the Word.

I found NHM online and listened to a few of Pastor Grant's sermons. Boy did I ever recognize that holiness inflection in his tone and style! Adding to that. NHM even has its own healing class. So, we started attending church and I went to a healing class. Ron Arevalo was the leader that day. Someone sitting near me inquired as to my reason for being there and I guess I was rather loud when I responded with my diagnosis. Ron asked if he could pray for me. Well, yes, of course! There were approximately 15 people in class and they joined Ron. I closed my eyes and strangely (maybe not) I envisioned my body lying flat on sandy ground. I saw my hand reaching for the hem of the garment on the man in front of me. with his back to me. But, it wasn't a man, obviously. I was literally living the Word of God. I saw myself as the woman who reached for Jesus' hem, knowing that if she could just touch it, she would be healed.

My faith swelled inside me so large that I don't think I could ever doubt who He is or what He has done for me. I am healed and cancer free! Now it's my turn to do this for others in His name.

He was fidgeting a little. As I curiously waited, he reached into his side pocket and pulled out a small object, which he quickly placed in my hand. Confused and taken off guard, and trying to process the awkwardness of this whole encounter midst heavy

work emotions, I stared down at a seashell in the shape of a front tooth. A large white front buck tooth. It was creatively glued onto a square magnet. Painted on top of the shell were two googlie eyes, a round red nose, and one protruding, sparkling gold tooth gleaming in a row of white ones.

"I search for seashells on the beach," he said, "and I make these little magnets.



Then I give them to people who might need a smile."

My obvious captivation by that colorful magnet was all this man needed as he quietly, and knowingly, carried on his way. As I slowly turned back toward the parking lot, looking into those two googlie eyes, tears stung my own. You know how you can kind of stop tears from falling sometimes because you don't want anyone to see you cry? Well, that didn't happen. All the way to my car they streamed down and I held that magnet in my hand and stared into the most significantly goofy little gift I had ever received. It was a turning point. The tears that would have painfully fallen moments earlier were now pouring in relief.

I think of people with dreams and ideas they feel are too silly and insignificant to offer the world.


has been on my kitchen fridge, and every time I look at it I'm thankful that a man walking on
